Guest Speaker ~ SEPTEMBER 2023

Hershel McGriff was our Guest Speaker for the September Breakfast Meeting at Longhorn. NASCAR Legend talked about his racing career, how he got his start and how he ended up in Green Valley.

Born in 1927 he started racing at age 17 after the WWII. He raced at Portland Speedway in his father's 1940 Hudson. In 1950 he raced in the inaugural Mexican Carrera Pan Americana road race. He won that race and beat Bill France Sr. He was invited to race in the first Southern 500 at Darlington Raceway. He drove his car from Portland Oregon to Darlington South Carolina. He finished 9th in the race and drove his race car back home to Oregon. (Bearing the painted racing numbers)

He has many accomplishments and had made NASCAR history for being the oldest driver to compete in a NASCAR sanctioned event running 8 K&N West series races from 2009-2012.

He shared that he ended up in green valley when he and colleagues purchased the mine in Green Valley!


We enjoy the club and look forward to getting to know all of you better!











Trivia Answers

1 (A) The first Chevrolet Corvette rolled off the production line on June 30, 1953, a the GM plant I n Flint, Michigan. Only 300 Corvettes were built that year (each of them by hand), making this the rarest Corvette. Each fiberglass-bodied two-seater was white with a red interior and a black canvass top. The 1953 features a power glide automatic transmission and a "Blue Flane" six-cylinder 235ci 150 hp engine with 3 carburetors and dual exhaust.

2.(C) Originally introduced in 1958, the Impala was he best-selling automobile in the United States during the 1960's. Early Impala models sported six taillights, a unique feature which, for a time, became the Impala trademark. The Impala was named after an African Antelope.

3. (D) The first Mustang rolled off the assembly line March 9, 1964, with a list price of \$2368

4. (D) In 1953 General Motors issued three specialty convertibles, the Buick Skylark, the Oldsmobile fiesta and the Cadillac Eldorado. Of the three the Buick skylark was the most successful with a production run of 1642 units.

5. The 1966 Jensen FF came equipped with the Dunlop Maxaret anti-lock braking system (originally developed for use on aircraft) Although crude by today's standards and sometimes unreliable, the Jensen FF anti-skid system was a huge technological breakthrough at the time. Three years later in 1969 the Lincoln Continental Mark III improved on the idea placing sensors on the rear wheels that modulated pressure on the rear brakes when they began to lock up.
