The meeting started at approximately 10:13 AM. We now are using Zoom for the meetings because of Covid-19.

The new board members were welcomed including new Vice President, Bob Smith, and new Secretary, Barbara Cotts.

A discussion was opened about processes with Long Horn restaurant including what they will allow and how long does the club hold off on member meetings to keep everyone safe. We also have to follow state regulations. The club will keep in touch with Long Horn and keep them informed as to when the club might return.

We are going to continue board meetings on Zoom thru September of 2020. Board meetings are set for June 1, 2020, July 6, 2020, August 3, 2020 and September 7, 2020.

The board discussed the Memorial Day run, the gathering place and the route.

The board opened the discussion for the 2021 car show. There are a number of things to talk about because of the Covi-19 pandemic. We will plan as usual the show in Tu-

bac so that if things are good we can continue the show. It was also suggested that we draw up an alternative plan in case things continue to be shut down and perhaps alternative ways to earn money for scholarships.

We are going to continue to work to get new members. One idea was that the Chamber of Commerce has a new site and board members are in conversation with the President and CEO to see how we can utilize their site for our benefit. The Chamber of Commerce has 8,000 people visiting them each month and people new to the area frequent the chamber for new activities.

The Treasurer gave an accounting of money for the club. Arthur stated we currently have about 90 households. Carol Shelton called the 6 members who lapsed in 2019 and all cannot continue for one reason or another.

There was discussion about the money we gave and our club's volunteers assistance for the Amado for the Chili Cook Off and Car Show. We will ask them to recripacate for our future shows.for the club show in January. Meeting was adjourned.

Lila Szedlus and her committee reviewed the applications received from graduating seniors at both Sahuarita High School and Walden Grove High School. There were 43 students who returned the required forms along with an essay describing their plans and why they should be considered. There were some really well written essays, this along with the consistently high GPAs and examples of community service made the selection difficult. In the end we selected 18 of the applicants choosing equal numbers from each of the high schools, it was not planned that way but that was the end result.

I think that each of the students we chose has both a plan and the will to succeed and that the Car Nuts can help with that success. The schools and professions varied UA and George Mason for schools and from Neo Natal nurse to Mechanical and Civil Engineer to Dental Hygienist and Game Warden and Chef for careers.

We awarded slightly more than \$20,000.00 using some of the previously awarded and returned scholarship money, this allowed us to have a minimum award amount of \$1,000.00 rather than the previous \$500.00. We have not written the checks for the scholarships yet, once we do the above numbers will decrease by the total amount awarded.

UPDATE ON AMADO YOUTH CENTER

You may recall the Amado Youth Center flooded the same time as the Cow Palace. Since then, several organizations and individuals donated funds to build a new center. The Car Nuts donated \$1,000 to help make this plan a reality. The Amado Chili Cook Off and Randy and Rose Estes Car Show earned another \$16,000 to that cause. Our Car Nuts members, Arthur Mournian, Jay Lucas and John Hepfer were instrumental in the planning and advertising the Car Show part of this event. And the latest news: On 5/13/20 it was announced that "The new Amado Youth Center took a big step forward after the Board of Supervisors approved a \$125,000 block grant for construction. Good job Car Nuts for helping our youth!

MEMORIAL DAY CRUISE


