

Fred Steinbach, a founding member, passed away recently. He lost his wife, Doris, several years ago. Fred lived at La Posada for several years. Fellow Car Nuts would take him to breakfast regularly and when that was no longer an option, they would visit him.

Fred became a board member in 1991 and then took the position again about 2006. Fred was a car enthusiast his entire life.

He was born in 1921 and retired in Green Valley. He and several other men decided

what Green Valley needed was a car club. The Santa Cruz Valley Car Nuts were formed. They established major events for the club and included their First bus trip to the Barrett-Jackson auction. It was said the men left the bus for the auction, while the women went on to shop in Scottsdale. What a great idea the women had!

They began to hold small cars shows and they grew each year. They eventually provided a vehicle for the high school students of Sahuarita High School with car show proceeds. The vehicle was presented to a student at the All-night graduation party for the seniors.

Fred saw his last SCVCN's car show last year. Members Rich Huston and John Johnston drove him to see our show at the Tubac Golf Resort. They took turns driving Fred through the rows of cars (after commandeering one of our golf carts.) I for one am thankful to Rich and John for thinking so much of Fred to do that.

# **JACKET DRIVE**

Once again summer is leaving us and fall is approaching, pretty soon you will be turning the AC off and have to wear a long sleeved shirt with your Bermuda shorts and sandals until finally socks will be needed to be worn with the sandals and the central heat will be necessary to keep the house warmer than 70 degrees.

That is what winter looks like for most of us, unfortunately there is a lot of poverty around us, both in Pima county and Santa Cruz county just to the south of us. Sooo, once again I am asking for contributions to a local charity that provides jackets and sweaters and anything warm to those who need it. The charity Warmth From The Heart, is a 501c(3), so you can get a tax deductible receipt. The founder and major force in operations is a local business woman who gathers the jackets and distributes them in late October. Jackets are donated, bought and stored all year long with the main drive beginning now, in September. Last year the CarNuts donated a lot of jackets and sweaters and other warm upper garments. This year CarNuts started in the spring with a big box of donations and again last week, at the September CarNuts meeting, with even more and heavier jackets. Those jackets have been delivered already.

In order to make it even easier to donate there are now bins at each fire station in Green Valley, that would be at Abrego and Continental, Camino del Sol and Encanto, and the one on La Canada east of Esperanza. You can drop the jackets off and they will be picked up and delivered to the staging facility in Sahuarita. If it is difficult for you to drop off the jackets, give me a call and I will pick them up from you and get them to Warmth From The Heart.

Some of you may remember when Tony Bruno spoke at the club meeting last spring, he noted that there are a lot of poor, monolingual usually Spanish, and poorly educated people who need the jackets and really appreciate them. If you can help with a jacket, sweater, sweat shirt or any warm outer garment it will be put to good use. And if you give it away maybe you will have a reason to stay in Green Valley a little longer and not return to where

you might have to use it.




