25TH ANNUAL COLLECTOR CAR SHOW

The Car Nuts are looking forward to the 25th Annual Collector Car Show to be held at the Tubac Golf Resort and Spa in January 2019. But, lets step, oops, drive back to the Santa Cruz Valley Car Nut's first Collector Car Show.

This show was held on Friday, April 26, 1991 at the Green Valley Mall. It boasted free cola, 10 cent hot dogs, 5 cent ice cream and free admission.

KGVY broadcast live in front of the long gone First Interstate Bank. The Car Nuts gave back to the community by requesting donations of non-perishable food for the local Food Bank.

This show boasted 30 fine vintage cars including a 1953 Kaiser Dragon, a 1948 Hudson, a 1936 Cady Convertible, a 1937 Zephyr Coupe, a 1966 AMC Marlin, a 1959 Edsel, a 1981 Dodge Roadster and a 1956 Continental Mark II, according to a news article published in the Green Valley News.

Now, let's visit our very first car show held at the Tubac Golf Resort: This was back in January 1994 and 118 cars entered. This information was provided by Joe D. Pierce, when he was President of the Santa Cruz Valley Car Nuts in a thank you letter written to the editor of the Green Valley News. He wrote the letter in 2003 comparing the 1994 show to the 2003 show.

He stated the 2003 show had 570 cars entered and filled the driving range at the Tubac Golf Resort. In the letter, President Pierce thanked the more than 100 members helping to create this event, the Sahuarita High School students who helped get the cars in their position and the Green Valley News for their great coverage.



BULLITT - THE MOVIE THAT MADE THE CAR - THREE TIMES

In 1968 movie stars Steve McQueen, Robert Vaughn and Jacqueline Bisset made a thriller film with car chases through the streets of San Francisco. Lots of excitement, gun shots and twists and turns.

Lieutenant Frank Bullitt, driving a 1968 Ford Mustang GT pursues hitmen driving a 1968 Dodge Charger R/T. Bullitt forces the Charger off the road and it explodes into a huge fireball.

2001 - Ford decided their Bullitt concept version shown at the 2000 L.A. Auto Show should be produced. It had a 4.6 liter V-8 and they put a factory serialized identification on each one to verify it was a true collectible. It could go 0 to 60 mph in 5.6 seconds according to Motor Trend. They produced 5,582 in Dark Highland Green, Black and True Blue.

2008 – Ford unveiled this Bullitt Mustang GT making it more than an appearance package. They added 15 extra horsepower and a dual exhaust system to make it sound like Lieutenant Frank Bullitt's 1968 movie car. It could go 0 to 60 mph in 5.0 seconds also according to Motor Trend. They produced 5,808 in Dark Highland Green and Black.

2019 – In honor of 50 years since the movie, Bullitt, Ford is offering a special edition and if you have the money go order one. They finalized the price at \$47,495. Its top speed is 163 mph – WARNING: watch out for the law. Ford isn't revealing how many units will be built, but the colors will be Dark Highland Green and Shadow Black. Heck maybe the classic cue ball shifter may justify its cost.




