## General Meeting November 2018

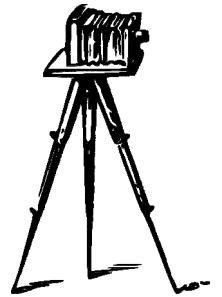
## A LOOSE CONNECTION WITH CARS

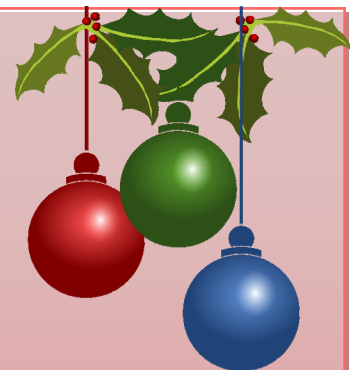

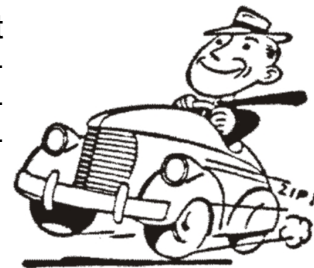

## 25<sup>TH</sup> ANNIVERSARY CAR SHOW REGISTRATION UPDATE BY BOB SMITH

Car Show Registration is currently running 17.8% ahead of the last year. Seventy-five percent of all registrations have been sold through our Eventbrite ticketing site at [Eventbrite.com](https://www.eventbrite.com). As of November 5<sup>th</sup>, we have registered 114 cars through the online system and 38 cars via the mail-in registration form. Mail-In registration forms are entered manually into the same Eventbrite system. Additionally, we have sold 86 Friday BBQ Dinners, 57 T-Shirt, signed up three new members and collected \$210 towards our Scholarship Fund. The Friday BBQ Dinner is 43% sold out. The Eventbrite system provides us a single platform to manage all registrations and merchandise purchases.

The Eventbrite system is very flexible. If you aren't registering a car, you can still use the system to purchase BBQ dinners and T-Shirts. The ticket limit for these items is one (1). If you want more than one dinner or T-Shirt, you will have the opportunity to make those purchases as merchandise during checkout. All you need to do is select one item as a ticket and you will be able to make your other purchases during checkout. You will also be able to make donations to our Scholarship Fund during checkout. We implemented this merchandising feature, so we can offer you these items at a lower price. Merchandise has lower fees than individual tickets.

Some of you do not have a computer, an email address or your just uncomfortable using a credit card online. This month we are including the Mail-In Registration Form in this issue of the Newsletter. When using the Mail-In Form, we need to have an email address to send out your ticket confirmations. If you have a family member, friend or neighbor ask them if you can use their email address. Notifications about the event and ticket confirmation reminders will be sent from system a couple days before the event. We absolutely need an email address for everyone. You will need these ticket confirmations to get your vehicle onto viewing grounds and to collect your merchandise.
